A SANCTIFIED LIFE (Acts 30:32)

"And now I surrender you to the Lord and to the word of His grace, which has the power to build you up and confer upon you the portion which is set for all those who have been sanctified" (Acts 30:32)

First of all I want to say a HAPPY NEW YEAR 2020. Grace and peace from God, our heavenly Father, and let the Lord Jesus Christ be with us all. We should be grateful to God if we are still allowed to enter this new year. We should be grateful because by His grace, revival and repentance of souls can occur throughout this world.
